READ CAREFULLY

Please become familiar with the Wisconsin Division of Health Rules for the Transportation of the Dead.

REGISTRAR: This burial-transit permit may be issued only upon receipt of a death certificate; not before. In special emergencies you may telephone the Wisconsin Section of Vital Records, at the expense of the applicant, for instructions.

FUNERAL DIRECTORS: The burial-transit permit is required for any manner of disposition of a dead body, including interment, storage, cremation, and transportation. A permit is required for each fetal death before disposal of the body.

When used as a transit permit for transportation by common carrier, this permit or duplicate thereof should be enclosed in a strong envelope attached to the shipping case. No separate transit permit is required.

Before shipment by train or express, the body must be embalmed; or if that is not practicable must be enclosed in a tightly sealed outer case.

SEXTON: It is unlawful for any sexton, or other person in charge of a burial place, to permit burial or other disposition of a dead body before a burial-transit permit is deposited with him. (The sexton may accept the permit of any state or of the District of Columbia, as authorization for burial.)

All permits must be endorsed and retained permanently in your files.

PENALTY for violations is from \$20 to \$200 for each offense.

PRIVATE FUNERALS: Refer to Rule H 17.06, Funeral Directors and Embalmers.

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
