Christian Demann died suddenly while waiting in the depot at Marshall, Minn., Thursday, October 22. He was born January 1, 1854, at Hanover, Germany. His parents immigrated to this country while he was a small boy and settled in Forest township. While a young man he went to Marshall, Minn., and engaged in farming, which occupation he followed until his death. The deceased is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Minnie Benson Frederic, Wis., Mrs. Sophia Remick of Forest, and three brothers, August of Castle Rock, William and Charles of Forest. The funeral was held Sunday at one o'clock at the home of Mrs. Sophia Remick and at two o'clock at St. John's church. Interment was made in St. John's cemetery. The following acted as pallbearers: Art Hamann, Henry Ludwig, John Schmitz, Joe Siemer, Fred and Jake Prinzing
