Funeral services for Henry F. Ludwig, who passed away Friday morning, February 2, from a coronary thrombosis, were held at the family home near Millersburg, Sunday, at 2:00 p.m., with the Rev. Silas Evans of the congregational church officiating. Mrs. James Collison and Donna Lou DeMann sang "In The Garden" and "Beautiful Isle Of Somewhere." Burial was in Forest Union Cemetery, with Arvid Johnson, Leo Shevlin, Sever Dalby, Dency Olson, Jess Berg, all of Faribault R.F.D. No. 5, and Gilbert Dalby, Lonsdale, serving as pallbearers. Henry F. Ludwig, the son of Fred and Minnie Yentz Ludwig, was born October 11, 1870, in Forest township. He attended the public schools, and was married to Henrietta DeMann in 1901 in Forest township. Mr. Ludwig was born, lived and died on the farm which his father homesteaded. He was a great nature lover. He was a member of the Faribault Baptist church. 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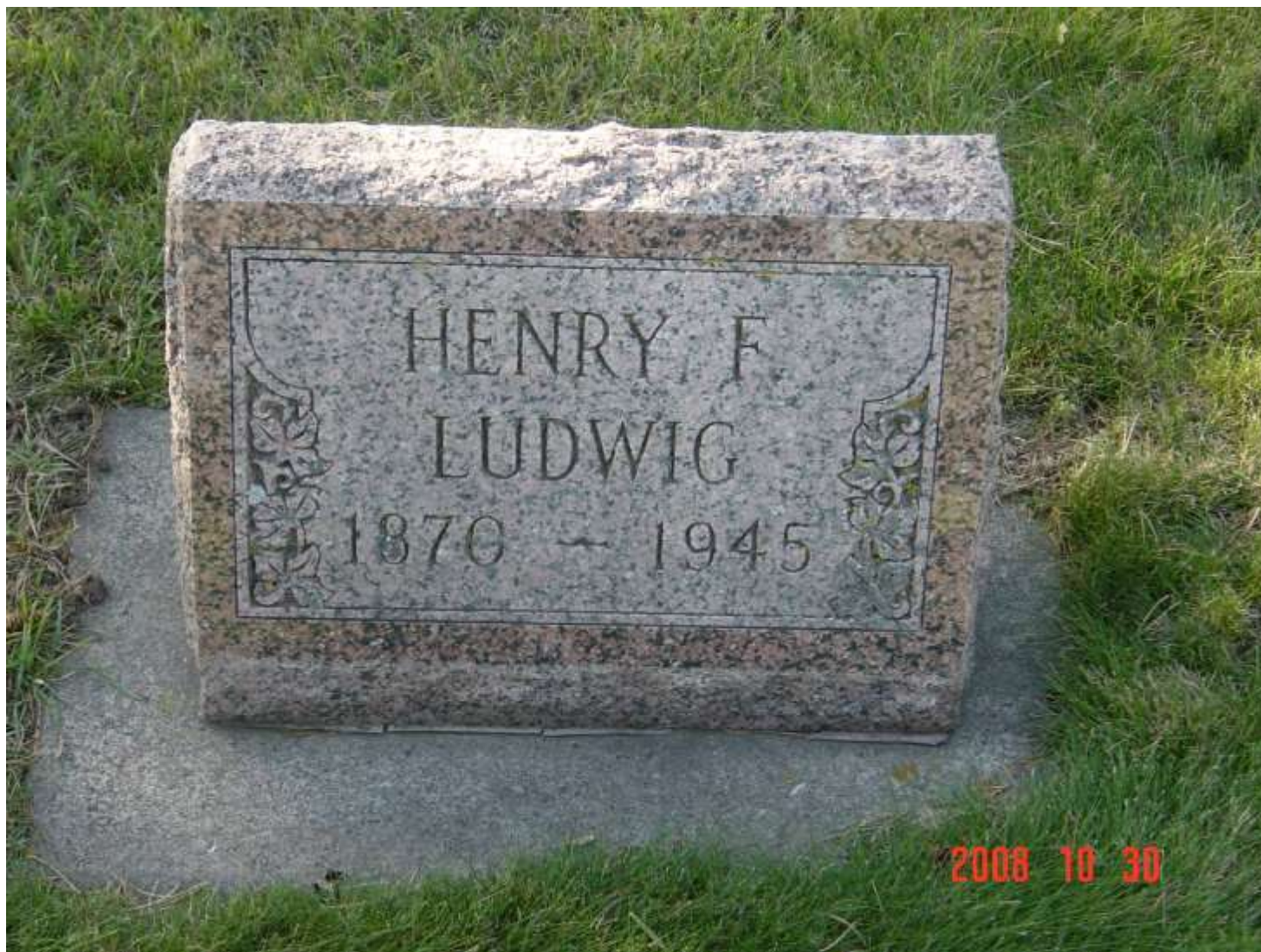
