MRS. PAULINA PRINZING DIED AT HER HOME IN THE TOWN OF FOREST, FRIDAY LAST, JANUARY 23, OF A COMPLICATION OF DISEASES. SHE WAS 67 YEARS OF AGE AT THE TIME OF HER DEATH. HER HUSBAND DIED A YEAR AGO. SHE IS SURVIVED BY TWO DAUGHTERS AND THREE SONS. THE FUNERAL WAS HELD SUNDAY AFTERNOON AT 2 O'CLOCK FROM HER LATE HOME AND AT THREE O'CLOCK AT THE FOREST LUTHERAN CHURCH. THE REMAINS WERE INTERRED IN THE FOREST CEMETERY.

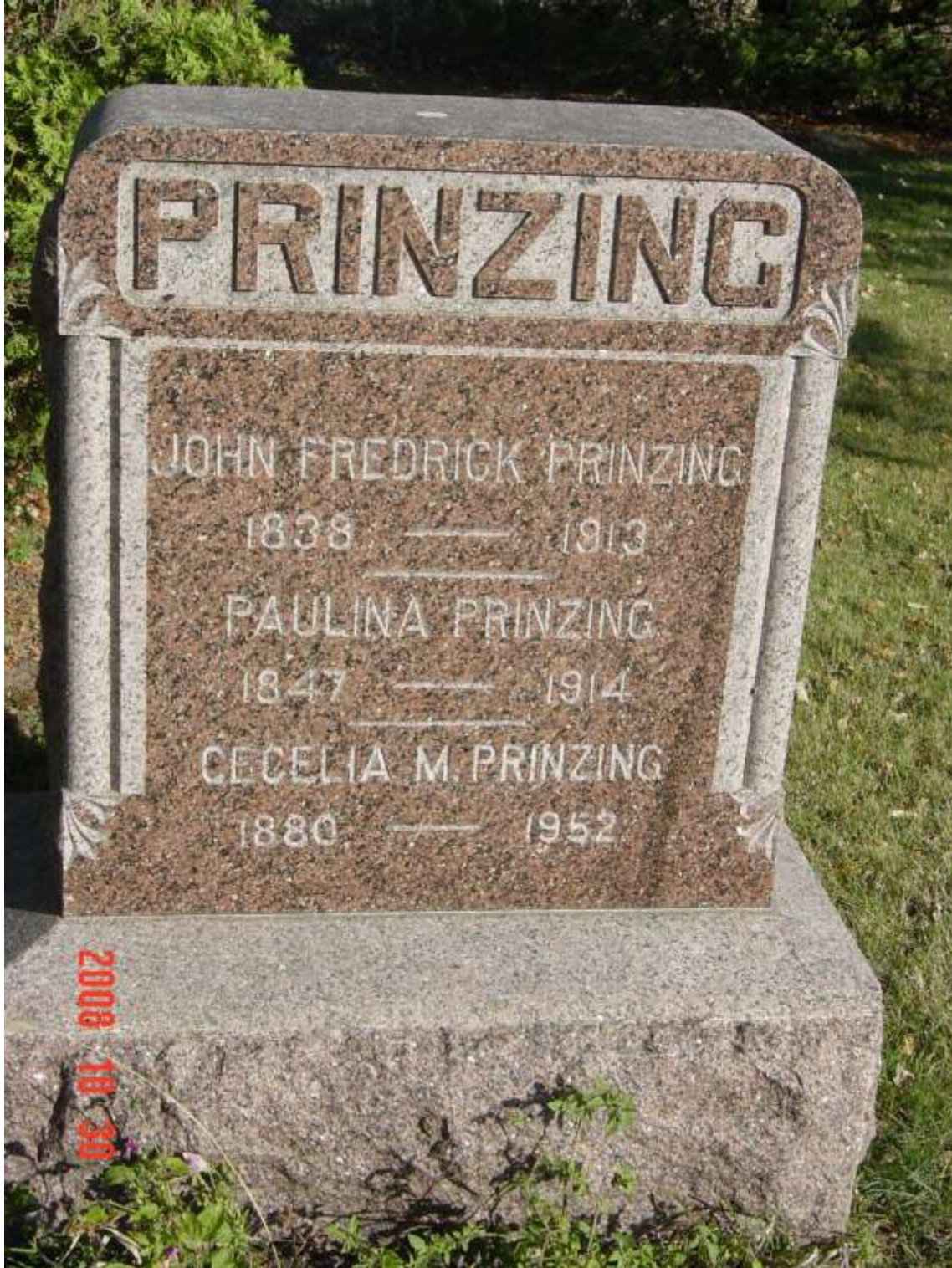
*Write "Burial" or "Removal" as the case may be. Burial permits must be delivered by the Undertaker to the Sexton. Removal permits must be given to the Agent of Transportation Company, and attached by him to box containing body. Subregistrars will write "Sub" before the words "Registrar of Deaths" and "Licensed Embalmer No. —" below, always giving No. of License. Fine or imprisonment for receiving a body for burial without a permit.

The sexton or person in charge of cemetery should give date of receipt and sign his name below, then forward this permit to the local registrar of the town, village or city in which the cemetery is located.
