This permit must be endorsed by the Sexton (or by the Funeral Director where there is no Sexton) and returned within 10 days to the Registrar of the district in which the burial takes place.

READ CAREFULLY

REGISTRAR: This burial-transit permit may be issued only by registrar of district in which death occurred upon receipt of a death certificate. In special emergencies, telephone State Registrar of Vital Statistics for instructions.

FUNERAL DIRECTORS: The burial-transit permit is required for any manner of disposition of a dead body, including interment, storage, cremation, and transportation. A permit is required for each stillbirth, before disposal of the body.

When used as a transit permit for transportation by common carrier, this permit or a duplicate thereof should be enclosed in a strong envelope and attached to the shipping case. No separate transit permit is required.

SEXTON: It is unlawful for any sexton, or other person in charge of a burial place, to permit burial or other disposition of a dead body before a burial-transit permit is deposited with him. (Such permits may be issued by a registrar of this state, or by the District of Columbia, or by any other state.)

All permits must be endorsed, recorded in your sexton's register, and forwarded within ten days to the registrar for your district.
